

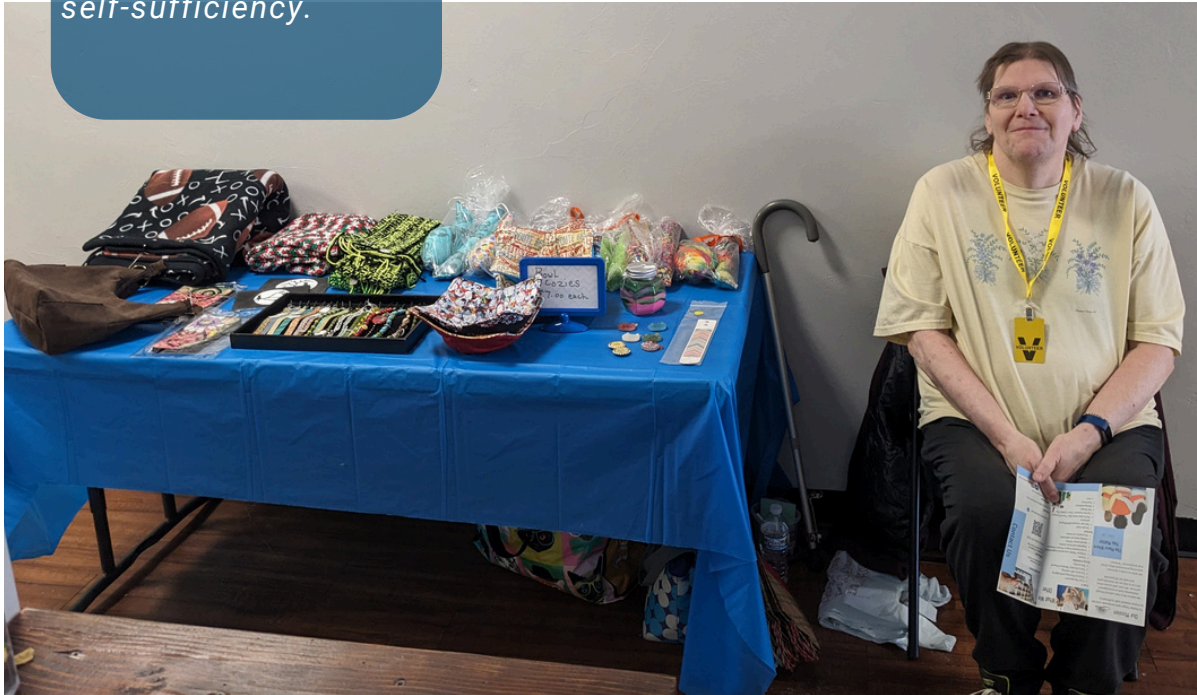

Stuck at an impasse and unsure of the correct documents and applications necessary to file for a business license, she sought help at New Day. "I would feel better having another pair of eyes look this over and help make sure I'm going through the right steps."

Paula had the drive, business sense and determination to make her dream happen; she only lacked experience with computers and the internet. Not wanting anything to stand in her way, we worked together to complete the process. Within a couple of months, she became a proud business owner.

"I always asked God what my purpose was and this is it. I can help make kitty's lives happier." She does this without question. Aside from using her skills in sewing and creating patterns for cat toys, she also makes blankets and other accessories. Additionally, she spends much of her time volunteering at Safe Haven Pet Sanctuary (our neighbor). She "spoils her babies" for a couple of hours every weekday after visiting us. Her (very popular) handmade crafts are sold at Safe Haven Pet Sanctuary, Pawfee Shop Cat Cafe and the On Broadway Farmer's Market. Her salutation when leaving is frequently, "I have to get myself in gear and get sewing!" as her items consistently sell out faster than she can produce them.
